The Australian Government's Child Care Services Support Programme provides services to support families and children who may be vulnerable to abuse and/or neglect. In particular, the Inclusion and Professional Support Programme (IPSP) administers an Inclusion Support Agency (ISA). Inclusion Support Facilitators (ISF) take the role of working directly with educators.

Find out the following information through research.

1. What services does the ISF provide and who is eligible to access their services?
2. How do they support children in families that are vulnerable to risk of harm, including those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds?
3. What actions need to be taken to refer a family to these services?
4. An ISF will most likely help your service develop a Service Support Plan (SSP) and assist with its implementation. How does the ISF liaise and consult with educators in a service such as yours while supporting children and parents?
